

# Welcome in the name of our Lord Jesus!

We are glad to be with you at the Lord's Name, the certain place where He is present to give His gifts. *You* are a gift to us today and we would love the chance to meet you after the service.

If you're new to a Lutheran Church and the liturgy, the service might be confusing. That's ok! Please, ask an usher, or the person next to you, for help if you get lost or have any questions. We would love to help you.

God's speaking through His Word is how He gives us gifts. It's how God serves us. God Himself is the Doer, the One who gathers, calls and is the true Liturgist in the Divine Service. "Faith is the worship which receives the benefits given by God . . .God wishes to be worshiped in this way, that we receive from Him those things He promises and gives." [Apology of the Augsburg Confession, IV.49]

If you have any questions about Holy Cross Lutheran Church, the Christian faith, or membership, please speak with an elder or Pastor Shamburger. (We regularly offer teaching in the Christian faith.)

# The Lord's Supper

If you are not a member of Holy Cross Lutheran Church or of another congregation of the *Lutheran Church Missouri Synod*, please speak with Pastor Shamburger or an elder before communing.

The Lord Jesus gives his holy Body and Blood to be received in doctrinal unity (Acts 2:42), teaching that His people are not to commune with those who teach differing teachings about Him and His holy gifts (1 Cor. 10:21). Rather, He desires that all who commune at His table receive His holy gifts in oneness with Him and one another (1 Cor. 10:16-17), in faith for the forgiveness of every sin (Matt. 26:28).

Therefore, congregations and pastors of the *LCMS* have promised to practice *doctrinal fellowship*, i.e. "closed communion", for the benefit and blessing of our Lord's holy people. As we confess in the Large Catechism, all Christians admitted to the Sacrament will have learned the Catechism.

In His gift of *Holy Communion*, the crucified Christ is both the Giver and the Gift. The same Body and Blood given over to death on the cross is now brought into our lives and given over to the sinner at the holy Altar. Jesus is always the Steward handing out His gifts (Luke 22:27). By His Word, He establishes us in oneness with Himself and His Father (John 17:17-20). According to His Word, He truly gives His actual Body and Blood into us, <u>Luke 22:19-20</u>; thereby we are truly joined to His saving cross.

# Comfort for Parents Regarding Children in the Service

Thank you to all the parents and grandparents who bring children to the Divine Service. As our Lord tells us, "Let the little children come to me and do not hinder them." It is a blessing to see your little ones doing what children do: moving around, playing, making noise, and even occasionally crying. For it is here (in the Lord's service) that even these little ones receive His gifts. None are too young! It is a joy to see them learn the liturgy, pick up the hymnal, and even begin to sing the songs of the church. We are grateful for the gift of your children in our midst today.
